## Acceptable Items

## Plastics

Recycle plastics \#1, \#2 and \#5. Look on the bottom of containers for the number inside the recycling arrows.

## Metal Cans

Recycle all food and beverage metal cans-steel, tin, bi-metal and aluminum.

## Cardboard, Newspaper \& Magazines

Recycle newspaper inserts, catalogs, paperback books, phone books and brochures.

## Paper Food Containers \& Cartons

Recycle juice boxes, egg, ice cream and milk cartons, and cereal and pasta boxes.

## Paper

Recycle envelopes, office paper, junk mail, greeting cards and file folders. Shredded paper should be put in a paper bag.

## Glass

Recycle clear, brown and green bottles and jars.


Please make sure your recyclables are empty, clean and dry before placing them in your recycling cart.

## Recycling Made Easy

$\checkmark$ Please be sure your recycling cart is at the curb by 7 a.m. on your collection day.
$\checkmark$ All your recyclables can be placed together in the recycling cart. Place your cart 2 feet away from the street so it can easily be seen by the driver.

## How to Recycle Properly

$\checkmark$ All types of recyclables may be placed together in your recycling cart.
$\checkmark$ If it looks like rain, be sure to close the cart lid. Wet paper products cannot be recycled.
$\checkmark$ Rinse plastic, aluminum and metal cans; remove lids.
